

The City of Deltona provides garbage service as one of many quality services of the City, and does so through a contract with Waste Pro of Florida, Inc., a private collection contractor with offices throughout central Florida. This brochure has been developed to outline the services available in Deltona and supporting Deltona's housing and neighborhood standards.

All Materials meant for collection (household garbage, recycling or yard waste) must be at the curb by 6 a.m. on the proper pick-up day and removed no later than 9 p.m. on collection day.

and yard waste bins must be kept away from the front of any building or premises when it is not collection day.

Please do not mix yard waste with your household waste. Commercial, construction or demolition debris, such as fencing, floor tiles, etc., are not included in collection service. Residents may call Waste Pro for a price quote on collection. Fees will apply.

Remember to call charitable organizations if the item is reusable.

Recycling: The City encourages recycling as a way to re-use material and to reduce the volume of trash in your garbage bin and in the landfill. Curbside recycling is provided to single family homes. Residents should place their recycling bin by the pavement by 6 a.m., for pick-up on their scheduled day. Customers must separate recyclable material from other solid waste and place such material inside recycling

THE DO'S AND DON'TS OF WASTE COLLECTION

Beginning June 1, 2016

Household Garbage: This includes food scraps, packaging, clothes, small appliances and other non-recyclables. Waste Pro will pick up two contractor-provided garbage bins 96-gallon or 64-gallon in size, or customer provided bins that are equivalent in size and durability, are a square style with a hinged lid and lift bar. (Neither the City nor contractor will be responsible for damage to customer provided bin(s).) All garbage must be bagged and placed inside the bin. For curbside collection, place the bin(s) within four feet of the curb with the wheels facing towards the house, lid opening facing the street.

Garbage bins should not be at the curb earlier than 6 p.m. the day before collection day. After collection, bins must be removed from the front yard not later than 9 p.m. on collection day. Do not place bins within three feet of objects such as mailboxes, parked vehicles, fire hydrants, trees, poles or other bins. All garbage, recycling

Yard Waste: This includes grass, leaves, shrubs and tree trimmings only. Each residential property is entitled to place up to sixteen bags of yard waste or bundled piles of limbs, per residence. The bags and/or piles of limbs may be placed in 32, 64 or 96 gallon bin(s). The 96-gallon bin may also be used for yard waste. Palm fronds and limbs may be neatly stacked and are required to be bundled (no piles will be picked up). Limbs should not exceed four feet in length, six inches in diameter or sixty pounds. Yard waste is picked up at the curb and mulched at the landfill for reuse.

Please do not mix other waste material in with yard waste. Material must be at the pavement by 6 a.m. on your yard waste pick-up day.

Bulk Trash: Residents must schedule a pickup with Waste Pro for all items that are too big to fit in the garbage bin. Please call (386) 574-0723 prior to taking the item(s) to the curb. Residents can place one large (appliance, bed, couch, etc.) or two small (chair, end table, etc.) For excessive amounts of bulk trash, demolition or construction debris, residents must call Waste Pro for a price quote on collection. Fees may apply.

bins for collection. Recycling is unlimited. Although Waste Pro only provides two recycling bins, residents may place unlimited recycling at the curb, as long as it's in a compatible bin and labeled "RECYCLE." Recyclables cannot be placed in bags. Items that can be recycled include all colors of glass bottles, newspapers, magazines, mixed office paper, aluminum and steel cans, plastic bags, phone books, junk mail, gift boxes, cereal boxes & pizza boxes (no liners) and plastics with recycling code numbers "1" through "7." Large cardboard boxes must be flattened and cut to fit in the recycling bin.



Recycling Do's & Don'ts Continued: Containers which held automotive, pool or toxic chemicals can NOT be recycled. To discourage pests from invading your recycling bin and to reduce odor, rinse cans and jars before placing them in the bin.

Tires: Deltona residents may place up to two typical automobile size tires (without rims) at the roadside for pick-up. Please call Waste Pro to schedule the pick up.

Motor Oil: In 1999, the State of Florida banned the disposal of motor oil from all landfills. Do not put motor oil in your garbage bin. Many auto parts stores have a collection site for disposal of motor oil. Volusia County Recycles keeps a list of motor oil recycling locations. Call (386) 943-7889.

Lead Acid Batteries: Automotive and lead acid batteries are also banned from landfill disposal by the State. Retail outlets that sell batteries are required to accept and dispose of old batteries when a new battery is purchased. Residents may also take batteries to the West Volusia Transfer Station or to recycling buy back centers for recycling. Please call Volusia County Recycles (386) 943-7889 for a facility near you.

Hazardous Materials: Household hazardous waste materials include not only motor oil and batteries but also pesticides, gasoline, paint, thinners and solvents, pool chemicals and others. These materials can be toxic to the environment and potentially contaminating to our water supply, yet these products are common in our homes and garages. These items should not be placed in your garbage bin. Typical household hazardous waste includes Please deliver hazardous materials FREE OF CHARGE to the West Volusia Transfer Station (3151 E. Highway 44) from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday-Friday and from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturdays. Watch for special Hazardous Waste Amnesty Days for special drop-off locations.
